				Social psychologist Jonathan Haidt, in his book The Anxious Generation, highlights how children thrive when they have opportunities for real-world connection and independence. He argues that over-reliance on technology and the loss of unstructured, community-based experiences—like walking to school with neighbors—have contributed to rising anxiety and disconnection among kids. A neighborhood school offers a natural antidote: a place where children form bonds with peers they see both in and out of the classroom, creating a web of relationships that strengthens their sense of security and identity. Bussing kids out of their neighborhoods risks fraying these ties, replacing them with fragmented social networks that lack the depth of proximity. It also removes this opportunity for unstructured time in their immediate neighborhoods without direct adult supervision.	
				Beyond community, walking to school has clear health benefits. Studies consistently show that walkable school zones encourage physical activity, combating the sedentary habits that have become more common as screen time rises. For example, research on school walkability—like that from the National Household Travel Survey—notes a steep decline in kids walking or biking to school (from nearly 50% in 1969 to just 11% today), correlating with increases in childhood obesity and related health issues. Keeping schools in areas with high densities of children who can walk safely helps reverse this trend, offering a daily dose of exercise that also boosts mood and focus.

I'm guessing that the density of elementary aged children in the Oakridge area is lower than in the Upland/Morningside areas (because few can afford a house up in the Oakridge area and they don't tend to be like my Upland neighbors who have 6 kids).	
				Third, I do not think that Morningside should be closed, but the three programs there do not work well together and the two specialty programs should be separated. I have had kids at Morningside since 2016 and the three programs not only are very segregated, but they seem to harm each other. The Regular class gets a bad reputation for being a neglected program and often dwindles to 8-9 students, which puts excess strain on the GT teacher to take an inappropriately large number of students in order to make up for the expense of paying a Regular class teacher to teach 1/3 of a classroom. The French Dual Immersion teachers cannot take more students to compensate for the small Regular classes because of the language barrier for new students, and the DI classes also dwindle from student attrition, but they cannot be replaced, again because of the language barrier for new students. It makes no sense to spend the same amount of tax dollars for a teacher who teaches 9-14 Regular students, a DI teacher for 23-24 students, and a GT teacher who has 30-31 students. This year's 4th grade Dual Immersion French classes have around 23-24 students each, the regular class has 14, and the GT class started with 30, now 29. It is inequitable to both the teachers and the students to have such disparities in class size, which leads to less individual attention for students in the classes that actually fill.

				However, I didn't feel like the comments and the questions my family have were appropriate for the environment present in this week's open forum at Olympus High School. In no way was this sentiment a reflection of the presentation, rather a causal result of the nature of dual immersion language programs and the voices heard on Wednesday. The conversations I witnessed that night led me to believe that an email would be a more effective way to share our perspective from a seemingly under represented community within zone 5.	
				Our family lives on the west side of Highland Drive. Our boundaries put us at 1.2 mi walking distance from the elementary school Crestview. Both my wife and I were born in Utah, but have elected to speak Spanish in our home to preserve our hispanohablante heritage. We purchased our house in 2018. At the time, our children could potentially enroll in Millcreek or William Penn. We were grateful for the odds we were given to potentially enroll our children in a Spanish immersion program. We were and remain incapable of moving directly within those boundaries. We recognize that we were never guaranteed placement in the program, and that the same is true for those living within the boundaries of DLI programs.	
				Millcreek closed a couple years back. William Penn is at capacity and rejected our open enrollment request. Crestview is not exempt from being closed. Before purchasing the home, I did thorough research and even contacted Wasatch Jr and Skyline directly to confirm that our address was within their school boundaries and that no boundary changes were anticipated in the near future. I was reassured that the current boundaries would remain stable for at least the next few years. Now, only months later, I have learned that boundary changes may soon go into effect that could potentially exclude our address from Wasatch Jr and Skyline. This development is extremely distressing. Beyond disrupting our children's planned educational path, it may also have a significant negative impact on our property value, the local tax base, and the sense of community stability. I fully understand the challenges involved in managing school capacity. However, I hope the committee to consider not only the short-term enrollment numbers but also the broader and long-term social and economic impacts of such boundary decisions. Families like ours made life-changing moves based on the current boundaries. Changing them places families in an extremely difficult position. Furthermore, schools like Wasatch Jr and Skyline already support high open enrollment rates, which should be taken into account when planning for capacity. It would be unfair to remove children's access to schools that their families bought into and planned for. If the propo

I understand that you are conducting a study about closing some elementary schools in the east region of Granite. I understand there is a general trend of lower enrollment in the Granite elementary schools, and I understand that closing some schools may be the fiscally responsible decision and in the best interest of the district as whole. I am writing to you to because Morningside should not be one of the schools to be closed, and I want to express to you, as a local resident and a Morningside parent, how important this school is to our family and our neighborhood.	
				Morningside is a true gem of a school. We moved to Holladay from the Avenues 3 years ago, and we chose the house we bought in part because of its proximity to Morningside. We live a block and a half away, meaning that our daughter is able to walk or bike to school every day. Beyond providing a great education and a safe, supportive place for our daughter, Morningside also has an incredible community. When the school has asked for parent volunteers, sometimes there was no space left by time I clicked on a sign-up link because others were so quick to fill the spots. You don't need to reevaluate every school, but how about those that have undergone renovation? Or, extrapolate the evaluation criteria from when the study was done and give a modified score (just as you extrapolated the insurance premiums at the start of the meeting). Your community is like a home, and it can feel as though families are being fragmented. I understand that emotions are running high, and I have considered this carefully to remain objective and focus on potential solutions. Full disclosure, I teach at Eastwood. I am truly trying to be objective.	
				One idea that came to mind — and I believe I am not alone in thinking this — is that transferring the programs at Morningside to Eastwood and Oakridge could help increase their student populations. This would allow students from the Magnet school and Duel Immersion program, to be redistributed without tearing apart their established communities, since the programs would be moving intact. Additionally, having two programs at a single school is not ideal.	
				Another consideration is whether it might be possible to close one school and hold off on closing others, to monitor how the situation develops. It appears that some schools have become overpopulated following other closures.	
				Finally, I am increasingly concerned about discussions of splitting the district. I believe this would be detrimental. A few months ago, I did not anticipate such options being considered, and while this might not directly relate to the current population study, the topic seems to be surfacing more frequently, which is somewhat alarming to me as an educator.	
				In summary, I suggest closing Morningside while refraining from closing additional schools at this time, but keeping the possibility open depending on future data from the study.

Students in these programs are integrated within traditional classrooms in meaningful ways, promoting empathy, patience, and collaboration across the student body. Relocating this program would be extremely difficult for many of these children, who depend on routine, consistency, and familiar relationships with staff and peers.	
				Concerns About Specialized Programs: While we value the importance of programs such as ALC and Dual Language in the right settings, Upland is not the ideal location for them. These programs do not contribute to smaller class sizes or equitable access for all students. Instead, they often unintentionally create divides within the student body, encouraging separation and stratification within our small, close-knit community. We believe in maintaining Upland as a true neighborhood school that serves all children equally.

Another example- both of my sons are dyslexic. My oldest applied for an Eastwood permit for his kindergarten year. He was accepted on a 30-day contingency and the Eastwood principal reserved the right to expel him at her discretion prior to the 30 days. I asked if this was the case for all permit students, to which the principal replied "Only special education students". The 30-day contingency was later revoked after I spoke to the district legal, but it is unfortunate that the culture of Eastwood is to discriminate against children with learning disabilities. My son ended up attending kindergarten at Oakridge where they did not understand dyslexia and he was denied FAPE. When we transferred to Morningside in 1st grade, he immediately started receiving appropriate intervention and completed 5th grade reading on grade level after chasing the benchmark since his kindergarten days at Oakridge. Additionally, many students have transferred to Morningside from Oakridge over the years due to being bullied at Oakridge and Oakridge teachers and administrators failing to protect students. These students found a safe and welcoming environment at Morningside, and achieved social and academic success throughout their years at Morningside. I was unaware of any differences I may have had until I transferred to a school located in an area represented in this study, which occurred in fifth grade. While I received a quality education and generally had positive experiences, I am aware of what it feels like to be perceived as different in a more affluent, predominantly Caucasian, and religiously affiliated community.	
				My wife also attended schools in the area of study, and our extended family still resides nearby. When deciding where to enroll our children (we live in the Salt Lake School District but wanted to have our kids closer to our work and to family if we found the right fit), we considered factors such as strong academic performance, the convenience of the school's location for commuting with two working parents (Eastwood's location is amazing and was a huge selling point), and the diversity of the student body, including the inclusion of students from outside the immediate neighborhood. While we recognize that a very diverse east side school may not fully represent a broad range of backgrounds, we sought a school that reflects a variety of life experiences beyond the local community that would hopefully be welcoming to "outsiders". Eastwood met these criteria.

They have never expressed feeling different—whether in terms of race, as they have commented positively on the presence of peers who share similar backgrounds (though such peers are not abundant), or in terms of religion and economic status, which have never been issues. The parking lot reflects a diverse range of vehicles, indicating economic variety, yet all children interact like that doesn't matter, because it shouldn't. This inclusive and welcoming atmosphere is what initially attracted us to Eastwood and continues to sustain our commitment to the community.	
				I am submitting this comment at the final hour because I initially hesitated to share this perspective, but I believe it is relevant to our decision-making process regarding the Granite District. During our research of schools in the area, we spoke with multiple community members who brought to our attention an issue related to inclusion that occurred at a nearby school. I want to be careful not to unfairly criticize any institution, but I feel it is important to be transparent about our concerns.	
				As a parent of children who may not fit the traditional mold of the "Cove" area, I am concerned by reports of some parents a few years ago at the other school that resisted open enrollment for children who do not live in the immediate neighborhood, with impressions that such students "don't belong." This situation raises worries for us about the inclusiveness of the environment.	
				Recently, at the last study meeting at Wasatch, my sister-in-law overheard two parents (one was from each school) discussing schools above Wasatch Boulevard. One parent stated she lived "in the Cove, by Eastwood," and the other responded, "that's not the Cove." Such attitudes feel exclusionary and unwelcoming. This concerns me as a parent considering the future of having my children attend school in this area—particularly if Eastwood Elementary were to close and be absorbed by that nearby school.	
				While I recognize that not everyone at any school shares this perspective, coming from my background, these attitudes prompt me to possibly reconsider our plans and return to our home schools in the Salt Lake District. As you are considering which elementary schools to close and how (an arduous process, to be sure), we understand that insights from parents who live and breathe these schools is important. My family found Morningside after spending three years abroad in Paris, France. Our two boys, Liam and Brennon Garrett, had spent three years learning French and we were keen to continue their language learning and enrolled them in the French Dual Immersion Program at Morningside. As you can imagine, Morningside's Dual Language Immersion Program has been an enormous boon to our lives. Though the French program is what brought us to Morningside, it is not what has kept us there. Instead, there are three main aspects of Morningside that have kept us making the commute from Salt Lake School District boundaries twice a day for three years.	
				First, the Morningside community-centered culture. As brand new members of the community who were commuting out of boundary, I expected to feel left out and worried that our boys would feel the same. The exact opposite was true. Due to the various programs at Morningside, the school has accomplished the impossible: serving as a neighborhood school to those kids in boundary while welcoming with open arms kids who have specialized circumstances that are not being served by their respective neighborhood schools. I peered over a student's shoulder and noticed they were writing about the 5th grade kickball tournament their class had won at the PTA fundraiser where students were randomly put into teams and given the opportunity to spend time with kids they didn't know of various abilities, backgrounds, and friend groups. To see both a specialized learning experience and an invaluable social experience highlighted in the same afternoon revealed how unique Morningside truly is among elementary schools. While my children have continued their French language acquisition, they have also attended book club, art club, and STEM club. They have run in the annual Fun Run, joined the school track team, and contributed to the Art Walk. They've seen the Nutcracker, attended JA Biztown, explored the Natural History Museum, visited Discovery Gateway, and learned about the water cycle on site at the Water Conservation Garden. As parents, we've watched them sing their hearts out at the annual Holiday program or express themselves through the Tanner Dance Program (which grew into a real passion for our oldest who was selected to dance at Tanner Dance last year). Their friends have participated in choir and submitted their art to Reflections and science projects to the STEM Fair. Because of Morningside, my boys know who Ruby Bridges is and will have memories honoring her heroism. 				Lastly, the camaraderie and teamwork among teachers, admin, and staff is unlike anything I have ever seen. I've been a public educator for 15 years, and I only dream of having a team that works together so seamlessly as the educators at Morningside. Over the past three years, I have volunteered to chaperone field trips, planned and hosted Valentine's Day parties, helped out during Earth Week, and played the role of recess duty during Teacher Appreciation Week. All this to say, I've had the opportunity to closely observe the teams of teachers for all grades except kindergarten. You may expect the specialization of programs in each grade to cause division, but I still struggle to keep the programs straight. I can't tell who does what! The respect that these teachers have for one another, the level of collaboration they exhibit, and the all-in attitude that runs rampant at every grade is astounding and it may be the reason why - at least from a parent perspective - the change in admin went so seamlessly. At the meeting at Skyline your director touted the closures as helping students, but all the data I have been hearing out of the schools to the west of us is that schools are overcrowded and the situation is worse for students in many ways. I also want to note that the capacities of the schools may decrease based on the new bill passed in the state to reduce class sizes in K-2. I think it is rash to shut 3 schools in light of this, since our current enrollment is very close to the capacity of a 2 school reduction. We don't want to crowed schools for the next few years. I am surprised that Morningside is not listed above 85% (score of 20) unless the mobile classrooms are accounting for more than 15% of the school. Which is a different issue regarding the ability to absorb students from closed schools. Both Cottonwood and Morningside have structural unreinforced masonry and while Cottonwood is larger (and could absorb additional students) it is closer to the Wasatch Fault, creating a greater potential for catastrophic failure. Personally, I would love to see a beautifully constructed new elementary school above 215 to accommodate the students there and save them from the URM (structural unreinforced masonry). While Driggs isn't without repair needs, it is in better condition than other schools. Driggs was recently renovated, though not seismically. I do not know the construction method of Driggs, it seems like a good candidate for retrofitting (though, I am not an engineer or building inspector). But it appears to be of a manner that is not structural unreinforced masonry, which is why I chose to send my children there versus adjacent schools. 				The strong PTA and parent involvement at Driggs is because we love our neighborhood, walkable school. If you were to shut Driggs it would be really hard for me, [identifying information remvoed] to be as involved. I don't think the theory of shutting a strong school to build up struggling schools is very thought through because the emotions of a school closure could really impact the willingness to help elsewhere. Also, what message does this send to other elementary schools? Don't get strong or you'll get shut down? We should be celebrating the strong schools we have left. So I thought I would share a couple ideas that I think make the most sense. I believe it makes sense to close 2 schools first and then let the dust settle. Give it 5 years and reassess. I think the Granite School district has made some regrettable decisions in the past (ie. Selling Milcreek elementary to a charter, closing Granite High, etc) before things had been thought through enough. Why tear three communities apart if not necessary at this point?	
8/21/2025 15:03:02				Option 1: Close Eastwood and Morningside It seems like an obvious choice to close one of the cove schools and bring that area together to attend one elementary school. Both schools are struggling. It also seems obvious to close Morningside. Currently, only 33.6% of the students enrolled at Morningside are in that elementary school boundary. This is because of the special programs that are housed within the Morningside walls. The traditional elementary school route at Morningside is failing. Also, the Morningside boundary that runs between 33rd south and the freeway, the old Milcreek elementary boundary, could be rerouted to Rosecrest to strengthen that border school. Rehome the French specialty program to Cottonwood Elementary to strengthen their enrollment numbers. I understand this may frustrate some of the parents that have their children enrolled in the French program but they still have the choice to switch to their neighborhood school or continue on the French path.	
				Option 2: Close Eastwood, Morningside and Cottonwood Elementary If the committee feels the need to close 3 schools the third should be Cottonwood Elementary. Cottonwood has a projected student enrollment of 315 for the fall of 2025 (per the PAC study documentation from the March 19 and 26 meetings). If you were to send around 160 kids from Cottonwood to Oakwood who has a projected 521 students for the fall of 2025, but has the capacity to hold 700-750 students, and around 160 kids from Cottonwood to Driggs who has a projected 422 kids for the fall of 2025, but has the capacity to hold 650-700 students, this seems like a simple solution. Even with these new student additions both Driggs and Oakwood wouldn't be at full capacity. The only problem I heard with going this route is that Cottonwood has 30-50 kids from out of the boundary who specifically should be attending the canyons district. There is a fear we may lose this enrollment, which is a valid concern. But let me bring up the point that this study is to better the kids of the granite school district! Would you really make the 422 kids at Driggs change up their whole life to cater to the out of boundary canyon kids?	
				If you compare Driggs vs. Cottonwood it's a no brainer that Driggs in stronger in all areas. I understand this is a huge decision to make, and that everyone has reasons why they love their own Elementary schools. This is why I've tried to take emotion out of the equation and specifically focus on numbers and statistics. It doesn't make sense to close Howard R.
